



IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE

Police, RMS & SafeWork Operation

On 24 August 2017 NSW Police, Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) and SafeWork NSW conducted an operation on the Sydney Market's site. This year's operation involved **11 Police vehicles, 5 RMS vehicles and 8 SafeWork NSW Inspectors**. The purpose of the operation was to identify persons using heavy vehicles and forklifts that were in breach of Road and Safety Laws. From this operation **105** heavy vehicle drivers and **57** forklift drivers received Random Breath Tests and **148** Drug Tests were also conducted.

Breaches identified by Police and RMS are as follows:

In addition, unsafe practices should be reported to an individual's own employer.
